

Easingwold Community Primary School
Remote Learning Parent Guide
January 2022



The purpose of this guide is to give information and instructions to parents to support remote learning for children who are not able to attend school due to testing positive for Covid, being required to self-isolate or in the event of a class having to close.

SECTION 1

1. When will parents receive work from school?

Each day, work will also be set and on Google Classroom by 9am.

Parents need to email the **class email address** if they have any problems with Google Classroom or if they have any device or internet issues.

2. What work will my child receive?

Teachers will provide work on Google Classroom each day and children will have the opportunity to listen to live lessons happening in the classroom and see work being modelled through Google Meets.

Each day teachers will make an announcement on Google Meet as to which live lessons are available that day and the times to join them.

All work set by school will be expected to be returned to the class teacher via Google Classroom by 3.30pm each day. Children will either be able to respond and edit a document set for them OR they may complete it on paper and send a picture to the class in the Classroom Stream.

3. What feedback will children receive about the work they have handed in?

Work received will be looked at by staff. You may get immediate feedback in the form of a private comment and numerical mark on the piece of work by the teacher or teaching assistant in your child's class. There will not always be detailed, daily feedback on all work.

Staff will be available via the class email between 8.30am and 4pm daily, there will be no communication outside of these times. This is to give teachers time to look at work, give feedback and prepare work for the following day.



4. How will school support parents and children?

If children are struggling with a lesson or new concept, please ask them to message the teacher on Google Classroom OR parents may contact the teacher via the class email address. We will then support the children, for example through adding an additional support resource, written comment or a telephone call.

If you cannot access the work please let school know as soon as possible and we will support you.

How can my child keep in touch with their teacher and friends to support their well-being?

After listening carefully to parental feedback from previous remote learning offers, we understand the importance of children having regular contact with their teacher and class. As well as being able to listen to live lessons each day, teachers will endeavour to make some time each day for the children to see and talk to their friends who are in school. There may also be the opportunity to join in with assemblies. In order for your child to take part in these sessions, we need you to follow the link below to agree to our code of conduct and give permission. Children who are attending school, will also need to have this completed as they will take part in the classroom.

Additional Information

1. Safeguarding

If you have a concern or need advice about a child please contact Mrs Cottrell via the office as soon as possible. If she is not available Miss Potter, Mrs Cooper or Mrs Brama are our Deputy Safeguarding Leads. If none are available to talk to you, somebody will get back to you as soon as possible.



2. SEND

All children with identified needs will continue to receive support during home learning. This will vary depending on the age and needs of the child. Work will be differentiated to suit your child as it would in the usual classroom. Children's progress towards targets will continue to be monitored and they will be reviewed at least every term through a virtual meeting or telephone call with parents.

If your child has support from an external agency it may be possible to arrange this with them whilst home learning but it will depend on individual circumstances.

SECTION 5

Frequently Asked Questions

1. What do I do if my child is ill?

If your child is unwell because of Covid19 or another illness, we would expect you to report their illness as usual. Parents can do this by calling the school office. Children who are unwell are not expected to complete work and submit it.

2. What do I do if I need a device to support home learning?

We have a bank of Chromebooks that can be loaned to families without devices. If you require one, please contact the office who can arrange it for you.

3. Does my child need to complete home learning?

If your child is well enough for school, we will expect them to complete their learning. Each day, we will register your child's attendance by their engagement with their home learning.
