SAVING WATER:

It's been the driest start to the year since the 1950s. Did you know it's been the driest combined February, March and April for almost 90 years? Little or no rainfall = low reservoir levels.

It's important we're all mindful of how we're using water and do our bit to use it wisely, especially while our reservoirs are low. Here are some water saving tips:

Saving water in the garden...

1. Use a watering can instead of a hosepipe - and make sure you water your plants early in the morning or in the evening when it's cooler, so the water doesn't evaporate in the heat.
2. Pause watering the lawn, it'll bounce back once we get some rain.
3. Put down the power washer – using one to clean your car or patio can waste around 700 litres of water.

Saving water in the house...

1. Swap to a shower instead of a bath and challenge yourself to a 4-minute time limit!
2. Avoid pre-rinsing dishes – scrape them instead.
3. Save loads on your loads – only start a cycle on your washing machine or dishwasher when you've got a full load and select the eco-setting if you have one.
4. A leaky loo can waste up to 400 litres of water a day, so fix those loos and dripping taps to make a big saving.
