Followed by a Giant Cookie

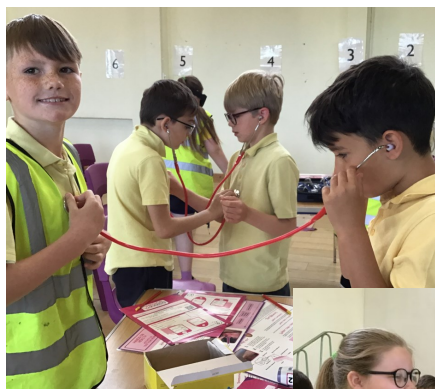
