This year, instead of a family picnic, we will be holding family lunch days where family members can come into school to have a school dinner in the hall and join us on the playground for some playtime.

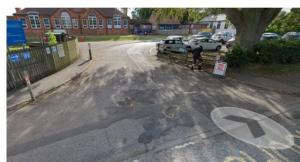

Jacket Potatoes & Sandwiches available as normal

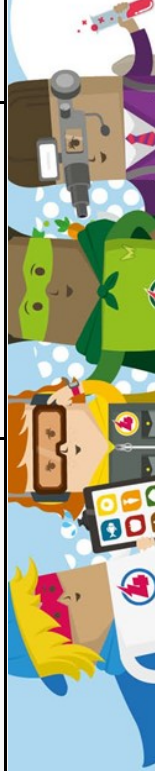
