We have really enjoyed celebrating World Book Day in school this week and the children have produced some amazing poems and raps!

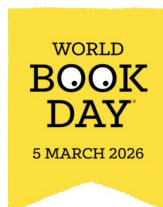
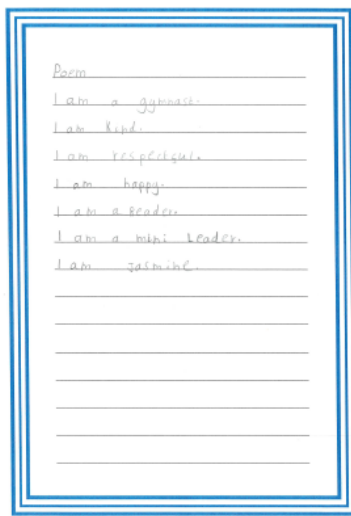
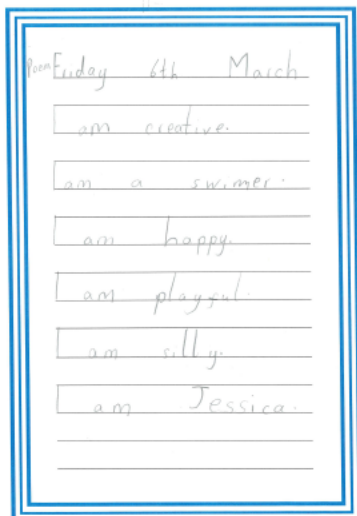
World Book Day Rap
