DIGGING PIT:

ROAD SAFETY:

We have continued to have concerns raised by parents, staff, neighbours and members of the public about road safety and feel very strongly that it will not be long before I am writing to inform you of a very serious accident or even worse. Please ensure that your children wear a helmet when riding a bike or scooter and that they stick to the rules of the road. The majority of concerns have been raised about children leaving the pavement without looking or riding in the middle of the road or in and out of traffic at speed.

Please may I also remind you of the following law regarding electric scooters:

- *It is illegal to ride a privately owned electric scooter (also known as an 'e-scooter') in public, for example on pavements, on roads or in parks.**
- *You could be fined and get penalty points on your driving licence.**
- *The scooter could also be seized by the police.**
- *You can only ride a privately owned electric scooter on private land with the permission of the landowner.**

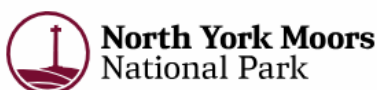
YEAR 3/4 TRIP TO DANBY LODGE:
