Dear Parents/Carers,

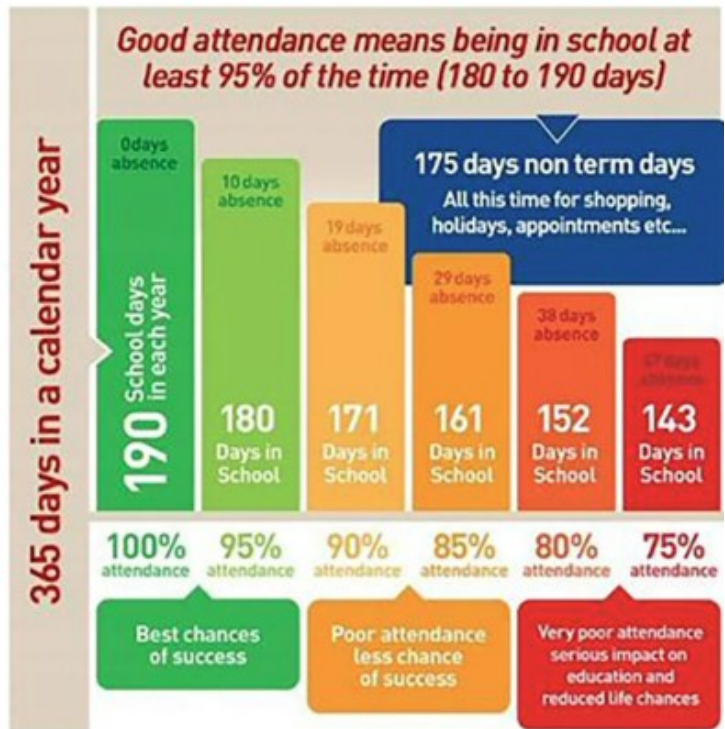

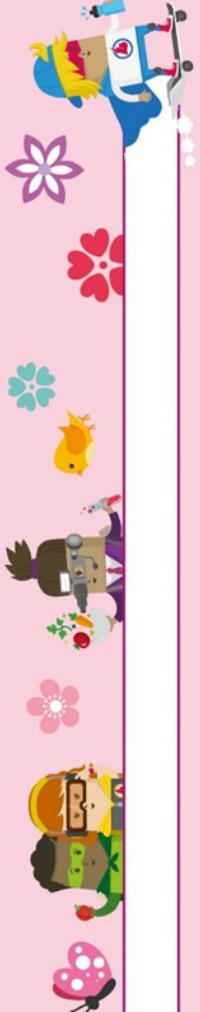
KS1 FREE SCHOOL DINNER TASTER DAY -
